

Ecosystem Services, Tourism, Community Engagement and Conservation Strategies in National Park September 9 - 14, 2024


The BETTER Life project consortium is organizing a summer school in the Czech Republic from September 9-14, 2024 focusing on socially engaged research in life sciences and the social benefits of forest ecosystem services. This programme is open to all students regardless of their study field.

Participants will be engaged in a comprehensive curriculum that includes classroom lectures, workshops and field trips in the Czech National Park. The programme covers theoretical and practical aspects of socially engaged research, including challenges and the use of specialized toolkits. Students will address real-life issues in national parks, focusing on the balance between environmental preservation and economic interests.

Key components of the programme include field trips to Bohemian Switzerland and Krkonoše National Parks, where students will examine the impacts of tourism and ski resort expansion on natural environments. Activities will involve data collection, stakeholder interviews and an analysis. Participants will interact with local communities, business owners, and national park representatives to develop practical solutions.







Development of an Internal Project Synergy Map



BETTER Life (BL) works towards uncovering dynamic measures to boost the adoption of project results among partners and ensure the project's long-term sustainability. With a full day of collaboration, co-creation and creativity at Halle University in Germany, an Internal Project Synergy Mapping exercise was conducted last April.

Key measures identified:

- Pool human capital and resources from similar projects to share tools and disseminate results for mutual benefit.
- Seek additional funding through initiatives such as "Hop On" and other grants to support ongoing cooperation and networking.
- Explore opportunities within university alliances in order to advance project goals.
- Host joint clustering activities and events with other projects to inspire and be inspired.
- Consider developing spin-offs or NGO's based on the BL project to sustain its objectives.
- Empower Early Career Researchers (ECR's) using the BL project resources. Together, we can shape the future of research!
- Build impactful networks by connecting ECR's with policymakers, businesses, and citizens. This is how innovation for real-world impact is born
- Integrate BL tools into educational curricula to enhance teaching methods.

Echoing the synergy approach, ACEEU organized a webinar on July 25, 2024 to foster synergy among five EU-funded projects. The BETTER Life project was presented by Professor Michal Lošťák from the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague.

The webinar was a resounding success, spotlighting the following collaborative opportunities to enhance project implementation and outcomes:

- Spread the word by sharing project event and training opportunities with partner networks to enhance collaborative reach.
- Tap into collective expertise by leveraging the strengths of various research groups within the partner network to strengthen future project proposal development.
- Stay in sync by organizing synergy meetings at regular intervals to remain updated on mutually beneficial opportunities.
- Unlock funding opportunities by exchanging information on shared interests.
- Explore opportunities for joint Transnational Project Meetings (TPM's) and Learning, Teaching, and Training Activities (LTTA's), where feasible.
- Expand project impact reach and deepen collaboration by organizing joint conferences;
- Explore the potential for joint publications to share our project results with a wider audience, including quadruple helix actors.

The consortium of the five projects agreed that these collaborative efforts have the potential to significantly enhance our projects' impact.




Driving Regional Innovation: Strengthening Collaboration Between Science and Business for Economic Growth


On June 26, 2024, Daugavpils University hosted a key discussion on fostering collaboration between academia industry within the framework of Better Life "Bringing Excellence project Transformative Socially Engaged Research in Life Sciences through Integrated Digital Centers", WP4 Capacity Building and Community of Practice. The event, organized by Daugavpils University Research and Business Center "REBUS" in collaboration with the Latvian Investment Development Agency (LIAA) Daugavpils office and the Latgale Planning Region Business Center, focused on leveraging scientific research to fuel business innovation and regional economic growth.

The session opened with remarks from prominent figures, including Daugavpils University Rector Arvīds Barševskis and Andrejs Zelčs from LIAA, who emphasized the importance of bridging the gap between research and business to drive innovation. Stakeholders from academia, government, business, and NGOs shared insights on how collaboration can create synergies that contribute to regional development.

Presentations highlighted available support for entrepreneurs and successful case studies of business-research partnerships that have led to innovative solutions. A key segment of the event involved World Café-style group discussions where participants explored how to align business needs with scientific offerings, enhance the regional innovation ecosystem, and improve collaboration between academia and industry. Participants proposed concrete steps, such as developing networks of facilitators, showcasing research success stories, and creating platforms for matchmaking between businesses and researchers.



The event concluded with open discussions and lab tours, providing practical insights into Daugavpils University's ongoing research activities. This gathering underscored the importance of sustained dialogue between academia and business to promote regional innovation and economic growth.



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
